The GSB is an international period of intense biological surveying in an attempt to record all the living species across the Southern Hemisphere in Spring. The aim is to highlight both the immense biodiversity spread across the Southern Hemisphere in the flourishing springtime, as well as to engage the greater public

in science and nature learning. Whatever you interest is nature is, whether flora, insects, birds, reptiles, mammals, marine life or other, please join up and let's show the world how diverse our corner of the world is here in the Overberg!

## The Big Picture – Seeing the Betty's Bay Landscape as a whole.

In order to understand our task as a Conservancy, come and see the broad sweep of the area. There is no better vantage point than a high point on Rod's Trail from which we can see, spread out before us, the various vegetation types that make up our slice of the Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve, get an idea of their special features, their possibilities and the challenges each of them face. We will hike to the high point from the village centre, take out our refreshments and talk about the splendours spread out beneath us.

#### Betty's Bay Baboon Management Program: Feedback from the Independent Assessor

On 23 August representatives of the BBC attended Dr Dave Gaynor's presentation to the Western Baboon Liaison Group. He is the Independent Assessor appointed by Overstrand Municipality to assess the current baboon monitoring program in Betty's Bay. . The Betty's Bay troop is currently on their annual migration to the Kleinmond area.

The BBC thanks the Betty's Bay Baboon Action Group (BBBAG) for all their work in educating residents regarding waste management, baboon proofing and the Betty's Bay troop. BBBAG recently coordinated a community project to install animal proofing on four municipal bins. The animal proof lid/locks were made by Marco, a Betty's Bay resident. The Farr family from Jocks Bay sponsored lids

for two bins on Marine Drive in Jocks Bay. A family in Silversands sponsored lids for two bins in their area. The BBC logo is on these signs too, thanks to BBBAG.

### Our first Facilitated Workshop for BBC members on 29 May ... led by Rosalind Bush



Our first membership workshop entitled "From Paper to Practice" was held on the 29<sup>th</sup> May. It was an opportunity for members to engage and jointly move towards making our Conservancy vision a reality by applying our mission and objectives to identified conservation issues. In spite of the restraints of Covid regulations and realities, 18 members participated in a facilitated process of

small group discussion. This involved the scoping of conservation issues, hitherto raised by members through the membership application process, and the prioritising of these with a view to launching conservation-in-action task groups. Habitat Conservation emerged as a key focus area with a particular emphasis on the urgent need to address indiscriminate plot clearing and environmentally inappropriate development practices. ## **OUR TASK TEAMS:**

Task Team: Habitat Conservation

In follow up to the May workshop, one area of emphasis for the Habitat Conservation task team is plot clearance and influencing Betty's Bay Estate Agents to the role they could play with new buyers. An initial introductory BBC letter has been sent out to the main Bettys Bay Estate Agents which will be followed up with face to face meetings. The intention of these meetings will be to encourage and elevate the environmental responsibilities that come with owning a Betty's Bay property. Various material is being gathered and developed to assist Estate Agents in this regard.

Contact with the local building inspectorate has been ongoing with regard to the distribution and use of Overstrand Municipality leaflet material such as "Building in the Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve". This encourages sensitivity with regard to plot development and discourages strip clearing such as shown below.



If you would like to be part of the current Habitat Conservation or Ways with Waste Task Teams, or if you have other ideas of Task Teams that you would like to initiate, please email the BBC. We are concerned about the impact of drainage projects on our wetlands and streams and the flora and fauna. The BBC is looking for people to help with a new Task Team on Wetlands.
